MEETING DESTIN CITY HALL BOARDROOM
AUGUST 2, 2022 MEETING - 4:00 PM**

1. CALL TO ORDER:

Chairwoman Trammell called the Special Parks & Recreation meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 2, 2022, in the Destin City Hall Annex Chambers with the Pledge of Allegiance immediately following.

3. DISCUSSION:

Mrs. Firth informed the members the city's intentions of partnering with the County (TDD) to purchase additional property next to the Tarpon Beach Trail, which is the location of the old Sea Oats Motel, with the ½ cent sales tax funds. Explaining that staff wanted to call the special meeting so they'd be aware this subject would be discussed at the August 15, 2022 City Council meeting. She also informed the members that the Deputy City Manager sends his regrets that he could not attend the meeting to present them with the information because of being out sick.

There was an inquiry if there are any preliminary plans yet. According to Mrs. Firth there are not any at this time, and staff should know more by their next meeting on the 23rd.

4. OLD BUSINESS: None

5. NEW BUSINESS:

➤ **Park Inspections:**

The members discussed the need to inspect their parks this Fall and to turn in items they notice that needs to be repaired or replaced this winter before the busy spring season starts.

There was a brief discussion regarding the Harborview Park and what needs to be done to it to get it in better shape, such as trimming branches and removing invasive Popcorn Trees and other plants as well as making some much needed repairs.

Regarding past Committee member Telford's responsibilities for her inspections, Committee member Johnson stated that she would take on the Dog Park inspections. Chairwoman Trammell stated that she would inspect the Children's Park at Morgan Sports Center. Committee member Piper volunteered to inspect the Barracuda Beach Trail and Committee member Schmidt agreed to inspect the playground and courtyard at the Destin Community Center.

➤ **Destin High School Baseball Field**

Mrs. Firth spoke of the request by the staffing members of the Destin High School to use either one of the Morgan Sports Center's softball fields and turn it into a regulated baseball field or continue to use the one at the Destin Elementary School with the city agreeing to bring it up to the necessary standards. She asked Mr. Reed to explain what it would take to bring the softball field up to those standards and how it would impact the programs if the decision was made to do that.

Mr. Reed explained they are still waiting for the school's final design for the field but as of now, none of the fences will be moved, and minor conversions of the field would be necessary. He also mentioned how the underground pipes that Destin Water Users have would have to be considered if the softball field is chosen.

Mrs. Firth stated that as of now, staff has only provided Council with the information and cost that it would take to convert the only baseball field in the city, which is located at the Destin Elementary School, to the regulation standards. She spoke of how she feels that this is the perfect location since its already in place; however, it would take about \$40k to for the necessary repairs. Additionally, this may all impacted in the future when the school removes the portable buildings and builds the addition.

For informational purposes, Mr. Keller explained the how the youth soccer leagues use at both the Morgan Sports Center and the Destin Elementary School.

Chairwoman Trammell spoke of how Destin Water Users is aware of the impact this request will be to them and currently, they are in a fact finding position with no decisions to determine which location would have the least impact for all involved. Especially since no

matter which location is chosen, they still would not be able to play an official game at either location.

Committee member Piper asked how this plan would impact the city of Destin Parks & Recreation and their budget, if any.

Mrs. Firth explained the cost for what they are requesting is unbudgeted funds and the city would have to come up with the expense.

According to Chairwoman Trammell, with her educational career experience, she knows the County gives charter schools all their necessary funds to start up. She also spoke of how the city has already forfeited four tap fees so the school would not have to pay them.

Committee member Johnson asked how this request would impact the city's sports programs that are already scheduled. According to Mrs. Firth, they already are fully scheduled and have had to turn tournaments away. She asked Mr. Keller to explain the spring and summer programs and how the fields are used.

Mr. Keller provided the extensive use of the fields to the members.

Committee member Johnson spoke of how the impact of their request would be to the use of the community property this is what concerns her the most, since the fields are meant to be used by the public and not the charter school, adding she cannot support their request to take the use away from the community.

Committee member Piper asked if the responsibility of keeping the field in shape would be the school's or the city's. According to Mr. Reed, it would be city staff's responsibility.

Mrs. Firth added that potentially, the same time they would be using a field at Morgan's, there would be small children present for soccer, and how there would be no way they could accommodate both at the same time. Additionally, there is impact on the public's use of the walking paths and their safety when a baseball game is being played that must be considered. Since netting would need to be purchased to try to prevent injury to anyone from being hit by a pop up baseball. Then, there is the need for staffing schedule changes from what they are normally scheduled to work to accommodate for the needs of the use between the times the students are finished practicing and getting them ready for regularly scheduled programs that typically start at 5 p.m.

According to Committee member Johnson, the most logical solution to this problem would be for the Elementary School to go upward for their expansion and not outward so that the baseball fields would not be impacted by the addition.

At the end of the discussion, Chairwoman Trammell stated that at this point, they still do not have enough information to provide a recommendation. However, she does feel that there should be something in writing so that the city does not continue to take on the maintenance past the timeline of when the school said they needed to use the field.

Motion by Chairwoman Trammell to recommend City Council have an agreement in writing with specification of a date certain when the agreement ends to revert the fields back to what they were prior with that cost being paid by the school. Committee member Piper providing the second. The motion passed 4-0.

➤ **Capt. Royal Melvin Park Update**

Chairwoman Trammell informed the members of the preliminary plans for the holiday decorations in the Harbor District explaining that since at the time of the decision, there was not any certainty that the park would be completed by Christmas; therefore, the decision was made to wrap the 4 large oak trees in the park with lights. Mrs. Firth explained that the contractor is now back on site and staff is present daily.

Mrs. Firth explained that staff is also working with the Capt. Royal Melvin's sons to help with the educational signs of their father's history for the park.

➤ **Member Comments**

Committee member Piper inquired about the status of the prefabricated restrooms for Buck Destin Park. Mr. Reed informed the members that he would bring this item to them at their regular meeting on the August 23rd.

Chairwoman Trammell briefly verified with staff the items that will be discussed at their next meeting.

Mrs. Firth also informed the members that if they think of any other items they want to add to the agenda to please contact her prior to the meeting so she can add them to discuss.

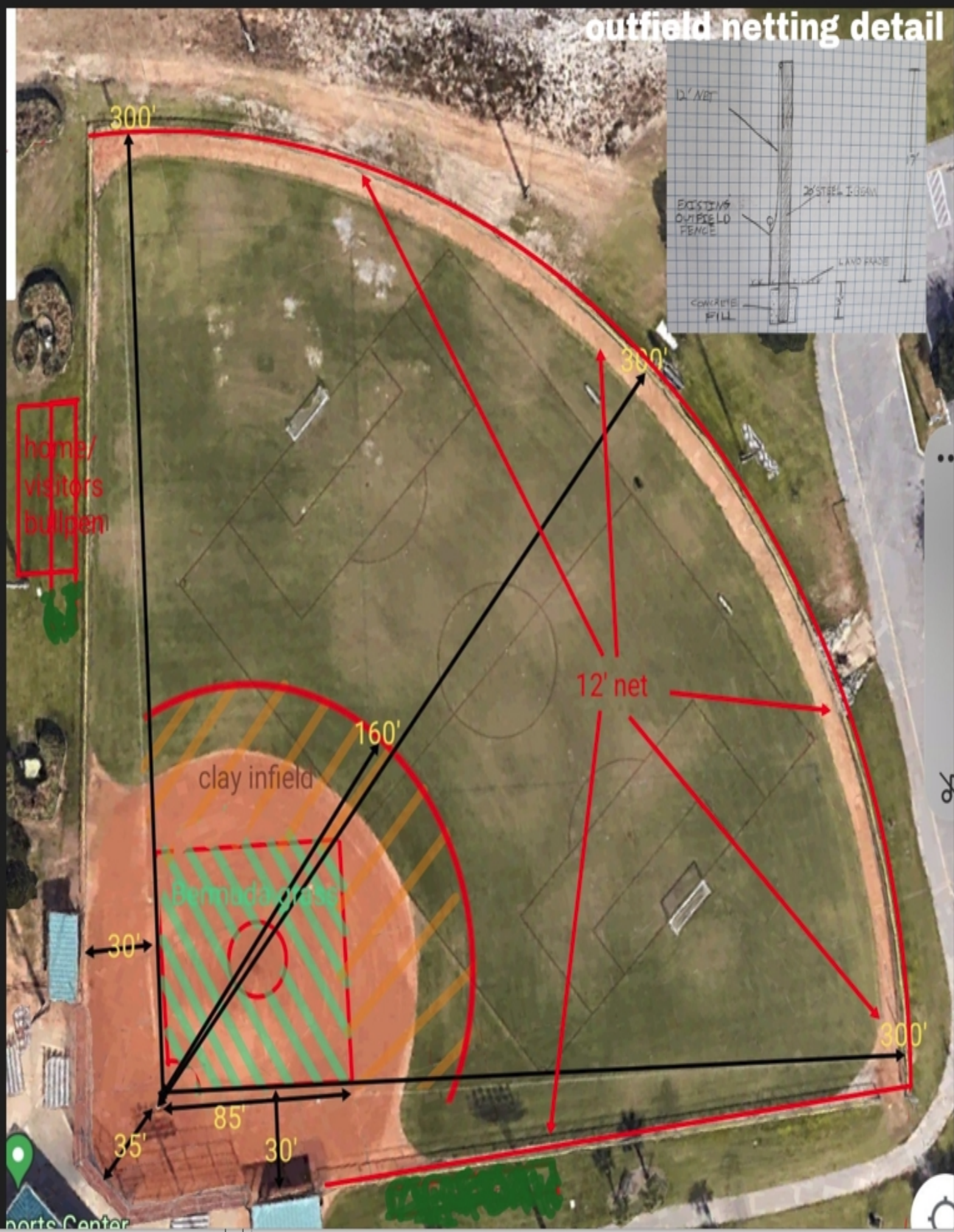

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The Need for Public Beach

“So how do I, as an 18-year citizen of Destin, gain access to the water? Walk over people in the public area? The public area boundaries are not marked, so what if I “trespass” onto the “private” beach. The tourists have no idea what is going on or where to set up on the beach.” – **Email to council from a concerned Destin resident.**

“I own a house and live year-round in Crystal Shores, Crystal Beach, Destin. We went to the beach on the 4th of July at 8:00 AM with out-of-town guests and **were shocked that we could barely find a place by the water to put our 4 chairs.** There weren't many people there at that early time, but the beach up by the water was packed with empty chairs and umbrellas from the vendors.” – **Email to council from a concerned Destin resident.**

“I am not usually one to write about being disappointed in something I have done or somewhere I have been, but this really has gotten me upset. **After 12 great years of enjoying our yearly vacations to the Destin area, sadly we will not be returning to the area. While the Gulf Coast is hard to beat with the beauty and ease of vacationing, you have now blocked the beach for us second class visitors.**” – **Email to council from a concerned visitor.**

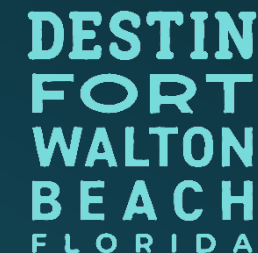

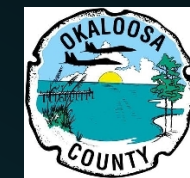

- Trust for Public Land secured purchase agreements with multiple property owners surrounding the Shore at Crystal Beach Park.
- Staff approached Okaloosa County and the TDC for potential funding opportunities.



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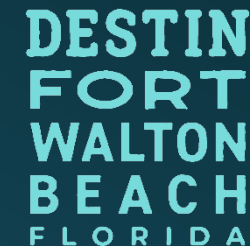
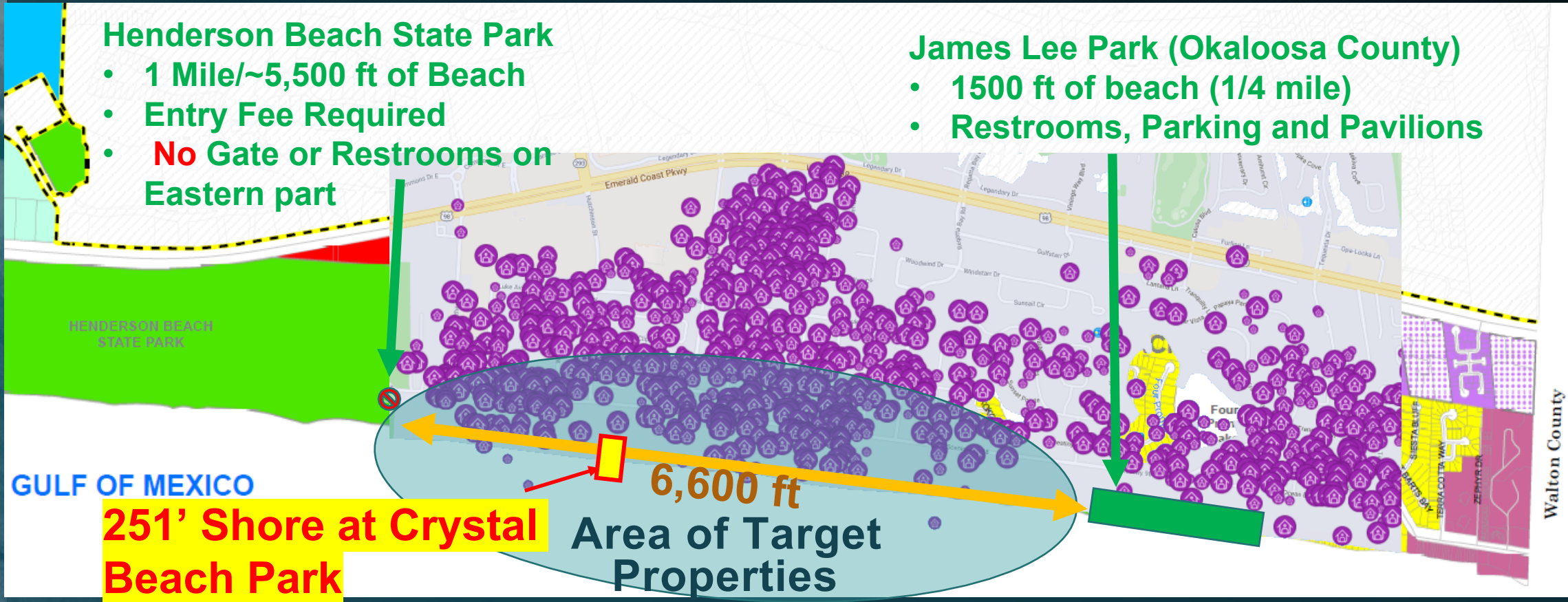

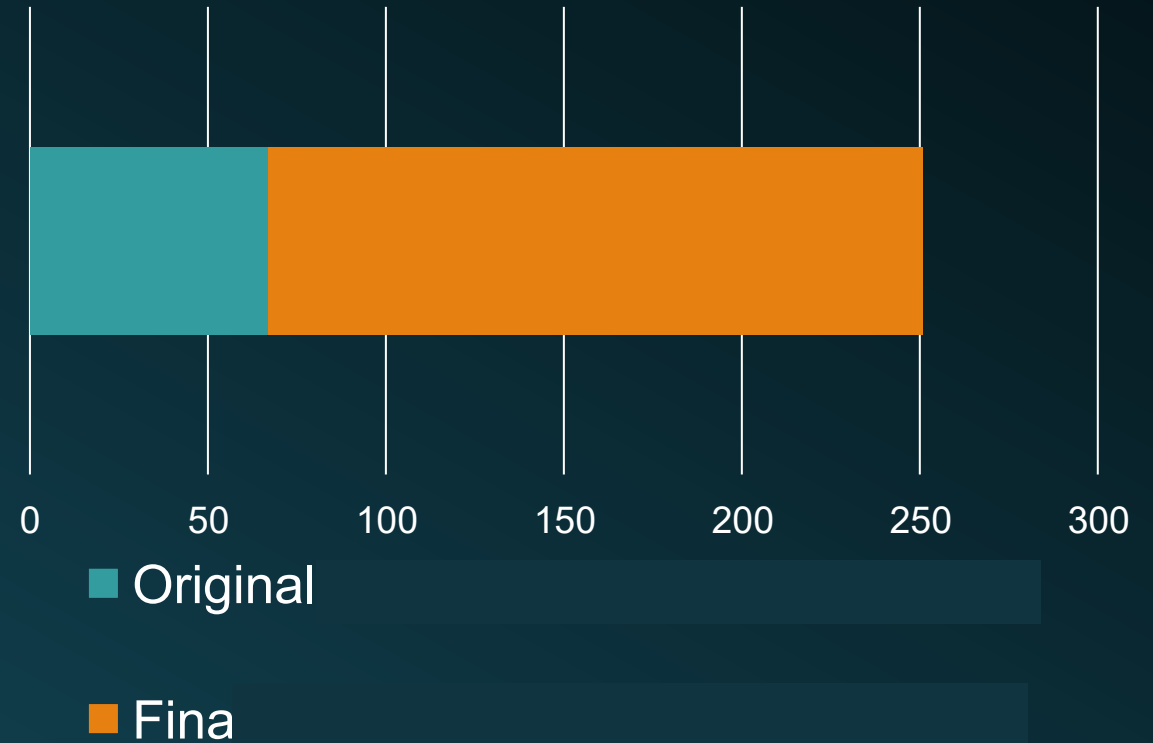

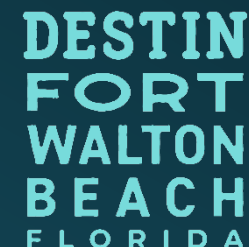
September 2021

- The Okaloosa Tourist Development District executed a new interlocal agreement with all nine municipalities.
- The County will set aside 12.5% of its total revenue generated by the first five pennies of Bed Tax for use by the municipalities, for a 20-year period.
- The municipalities agreed that the City of Destin will receive 48.5% of the 12.5% set-aside.

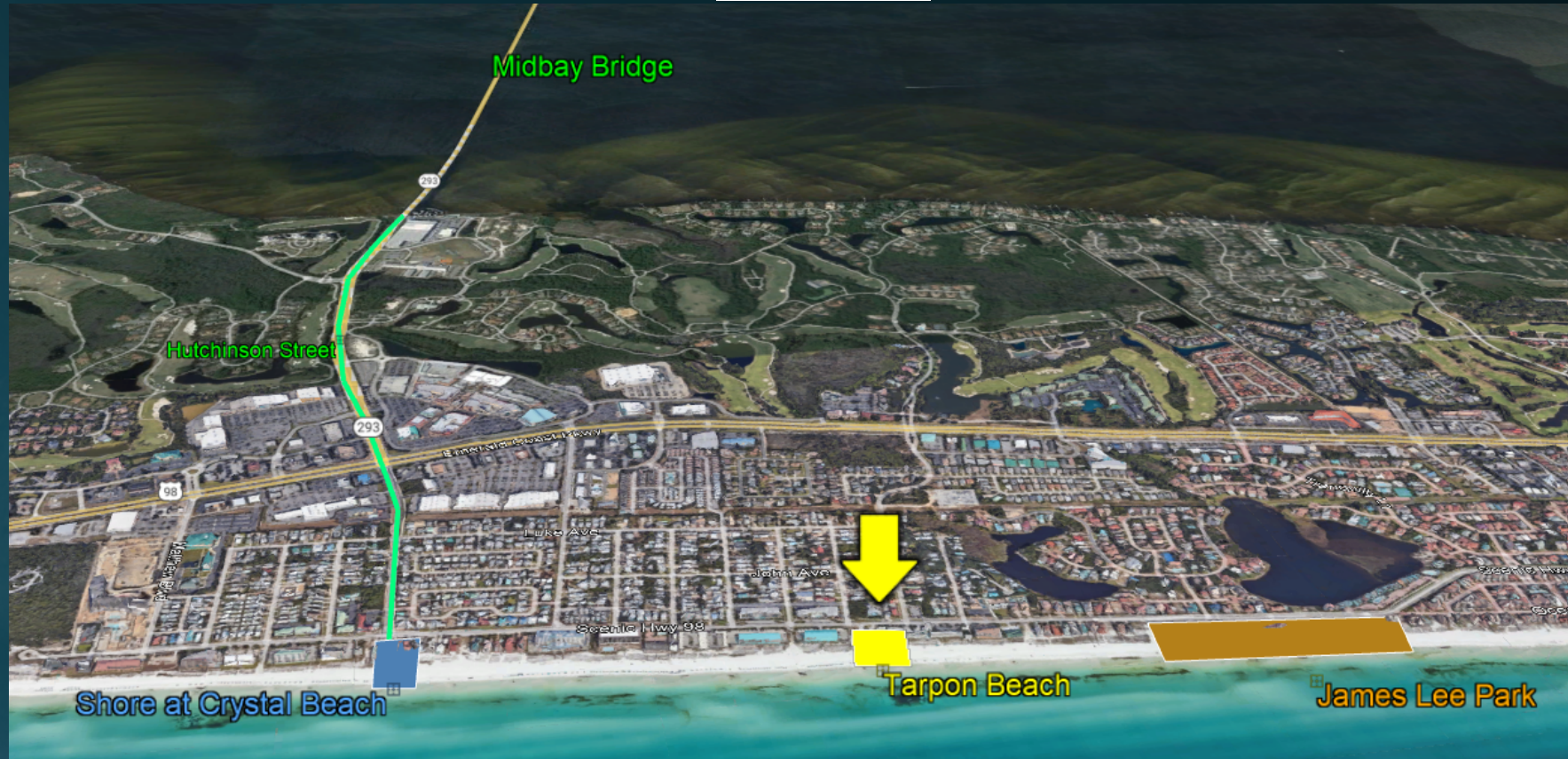

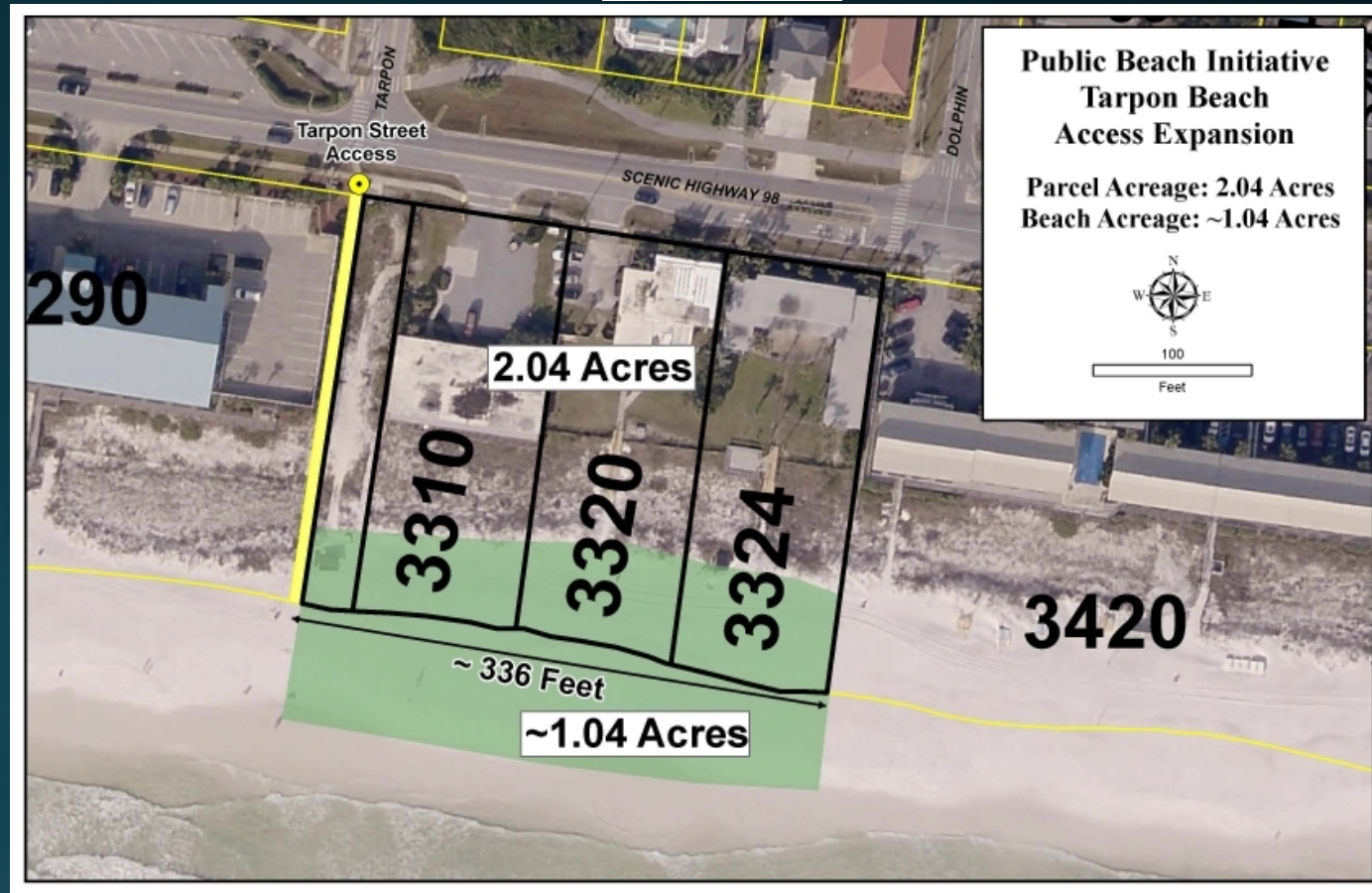
- Conservative estimates have the City's annual share to amount to approximately \$1.6 million.
 - By statute, expenditures must increase tourism or improve tourist experience in our locality.
 - Beach acquisition is specifically recognized by statute as an authorized use.
- Traditional waterfront park maintenance money (~\$450K annually) funding is expected to come from the municipal share revenue.
 - TDC has budgeted \$258K for Destin park maintenance funds, above the municipal share, for the draft FY23 TDC budget. Destin officials are told that traditional funding source will not be provided in subsequent years (FY24 and beyond).

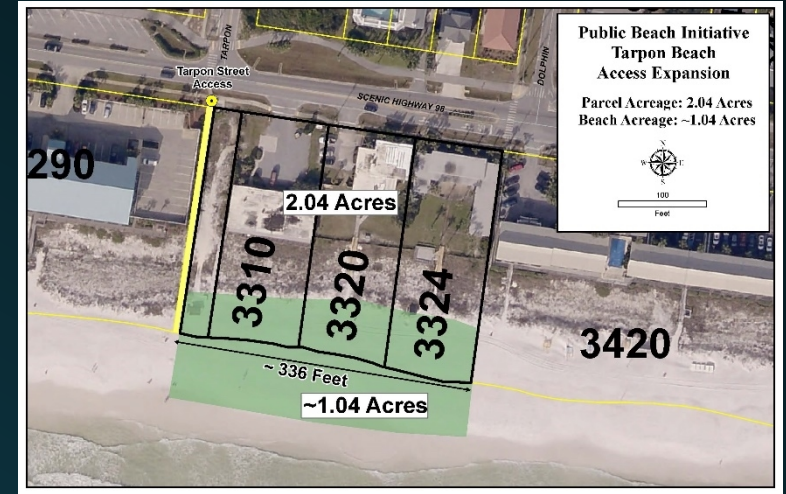

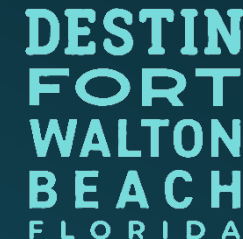
- The Trust for Public Land has a \$14 million purchase agreement with an option to purchase in October (Closing in November).

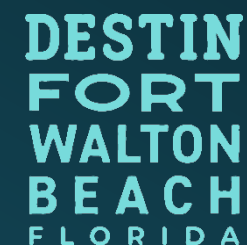
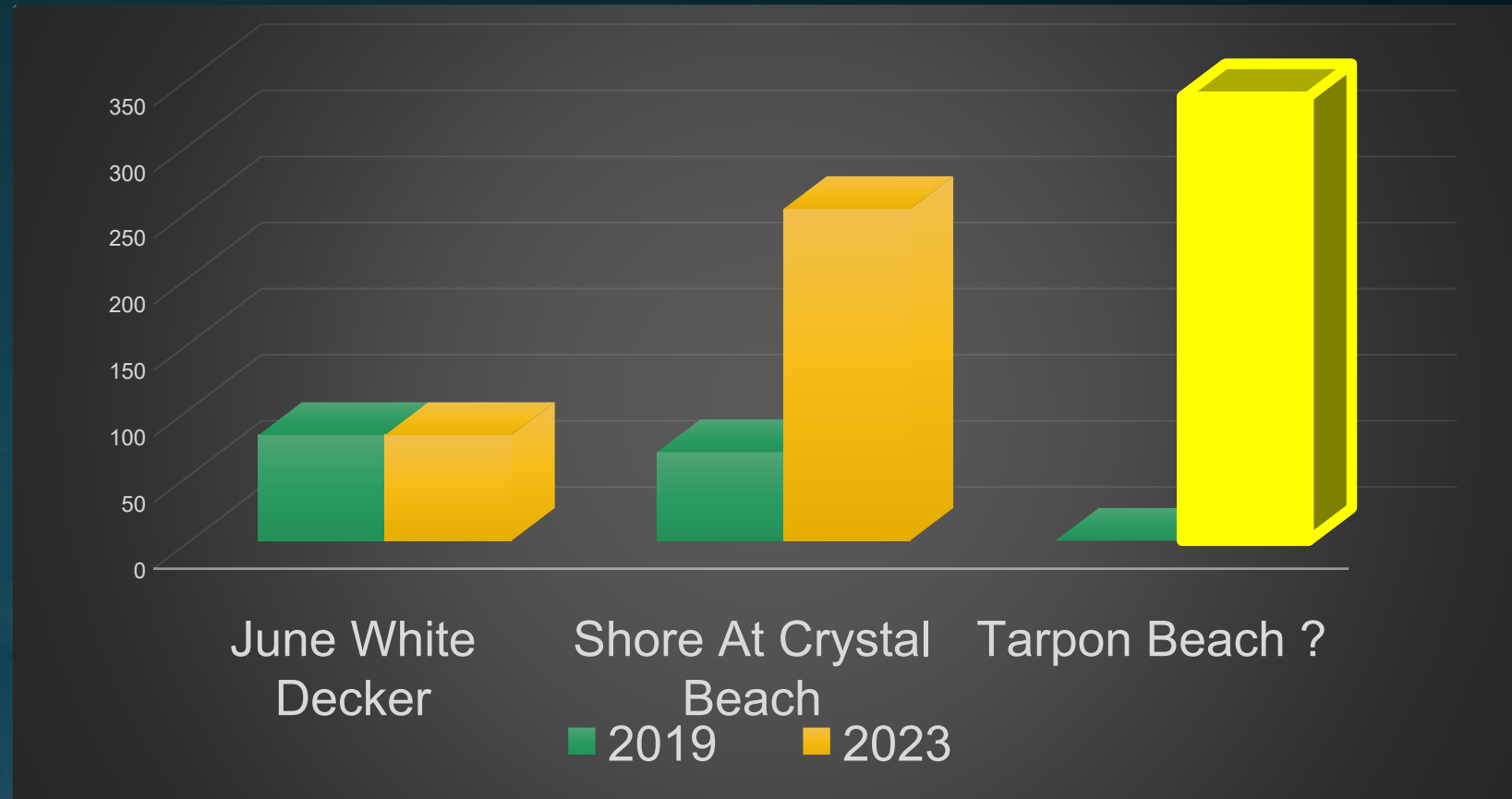

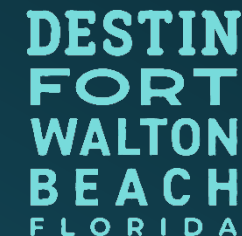


Waterfront Footage of City of Destin Operated Beach Parks



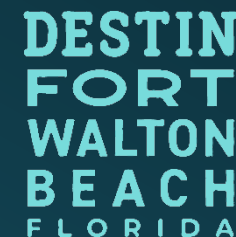

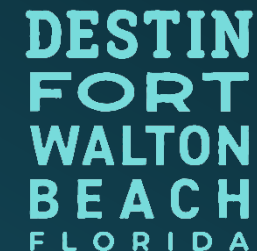

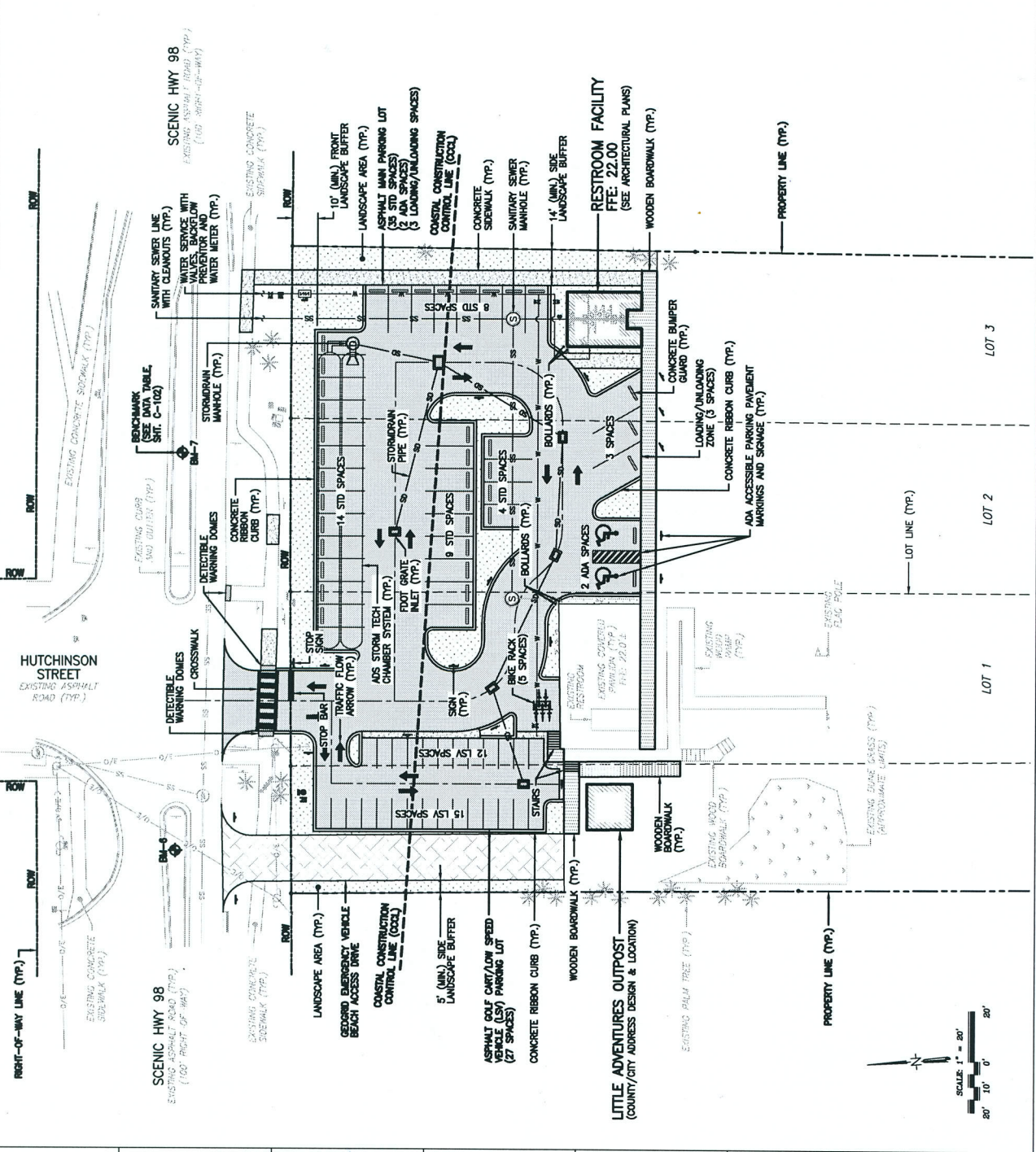

Parks and Recreation

The Morgan Sports Center, the Destin Sports Complex, and the Dalton Threadgill facilities are home to numerous recreational programs, rentals, partnerships, tournaments, special events, and other activities. The City of Destin programs take field priority over all other activities/events. 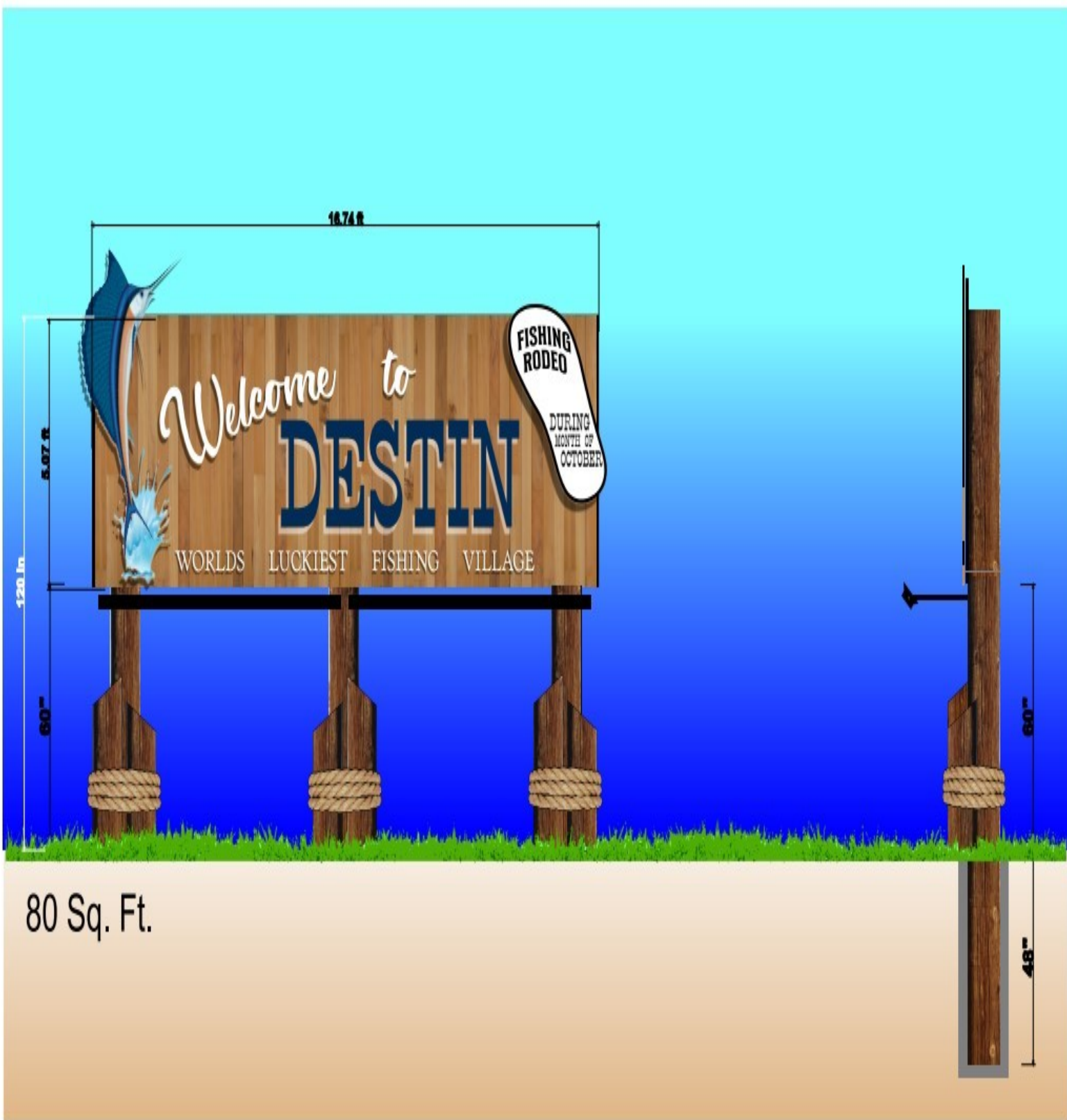

Discussion and or Recommendation**

I. BACKGROUND:

Over the past three (3) years, the City has diligently and judiciously undertaken the task of updating and aligning the City's Comprehensive Plan with the Future Land Use Map and the Zoning Map. That task is now complete. The City now needs to update and align the City's Land Development Code (LDC) with the recent changes to the Comprehensive Plan. In order to ensure that the Articles updated in the LDC are consistent with the Comprehensive Plan, a review of the Comprehensive Plan goals, objectives, and policies was necessary.

The initial review was to establish what goals, policies, and objectives have been implemented, in progress of being implemented, and ones that have not been implemented through the LDC. Staff then conducted an internal review of the identified policies and has provided our recommendation. Staff is now seeking a discussion and review by the LPA of these goals, policies, and objectives to see if they need to be updated, maintained, or removed.

Staff will bring these to the LPA on a Chapter by Chapter basis based on the number of goals, policies, and objectives that require review.

II. DISCUSSION:

At the regularly scheduled LPA meeting on the May 26, 2022, the LPA passed a motion to recommend all language from the Comprehensive Plan Policies pertaining to time frames for implementation, i.e., “within one year of approval of this Comprehensive Plan...” or “within one year of the next Evaluation and Review (EAR)...” Therefore, any Objectives, Policies, or Goals with any such language, will be recommended for deletion.

Partially Implemented Policies & Objectives

- 1) **Policy 7-1.3.4: Provide Bicycle Parking Facilities.** Prior to the next EAR (est. 2019), bicycle storage facilities or racks shall be placed at all city-owned community parks, neighborhood parks, and all beach and shoreline access points.

Staff Comment: This policy is being implemented and will continue to be further implemented through requirements shown in Table 8-6: *Number Of Vehicle And Bicycle Parking Spaces Required*. Staff recommends this policy be kept and maintained.

- 2) **Policy 7-1.3.5: Provide Public Information Regarding Bicycle and Pedestrian Facilities.** Prior to the next EAR, the City shall seek assistance from the Okaloosa County TDC, the Okaloosa County Board of County Commissioners, and/or other appropriate support to print and distribute a pamphlet and/or map illustrating bicycle and pedestrian routes leading to beach access points and other major destinations with the City. This pamphlet and/or information shall be posted on the City's internet site.

Staff Comment: This policy will be implemented through the Wayfinding Master Plan and Program. This policy should remain in the Comprehensive Plan.

Policies & Objectives to be implemented through the LDC Update

- 1) **Policy 7-1.2.5: Vertical Open Space and Scenic Vistas.** Waterfront views and vistas are important to the character and quality of life for Destin residents as well as for maintaining a viable tourism economy. Site development shall occur in a manner that retains views to shore line areas for adjacent inland properties, public places, streets, and bicycle pathways. Prior to the next Evaluation and Appraisal Review (EAR) estimated to be in 2019, the LDC shall provide standards that address site development, building mass and height, and fencing design that promote waterfront views and vistas.

Staff Comment: This policy has somewhat been implemented through LDC Section 7.09.03 – *Design Review Requirements* for view corridors. However, the regulations do not have any real specific standards for development. To fully implement this policy, **View Corridors** must be identified, prioritized and specific standards for building massing and location must be developed.

Staff has identified several locations of view corridors that consist of Right of Way with direct access to the Gulf of Mexico, Choctawhatchee Bay, or bayous, (see attached map). Are there any specific view corridors that the LPA wants to identify and recommend?

Policies & Objectives that need further guidance for implementation

- 1) **OBJECTIVE 7-1.1: MONITOR THE ADEQUACY OF THE SYSTEM OF PARKS AND RECREATION.** The City shall on an annual basis and prior to adoption of the annual capital budget, review the need for new recreation sites, beach and shoreline access points, and recreation facilities. The analysis shall be predicated on data, standards, and policies contained in the Comprehensive Plan. The analysis shall be directed toward maintaining a system of recreational sites and facilities that are responsive to user needs.

Staff Comment: See comment after Policy 4.

- 2) **Policy 7-1.1.1: Review Recreation Needs Annually.** The City shall review recreation space and facility needs on at least an annual basis for compliance with the City's levels of service standards.

Staff Comment: See comment after Policy 4.

- 3) **Policy 7-1.1.13: Evaluate Recreational Activities and Facilities at Park Sites.** The City shall annually evaluate facilities and activities occurring or planned at each park site. This annual evaluation shall compare recreation space and facility demands and needs with adopted level of service standards set forth within the Comprehensive Plan.

Staff Comment: See comment after Policy 4.

- 4) **Policy 7-1.4.4: Provide Recreation Facility Standards and Guidelines.** Prior to the next EAR, the LDC shall include minimum acceptable recreation facilities standards within new residential developments. Additionally, with the above specified timeframe, the City shall develop a recreation facility guideline for residential development that lists minimum acceptable recreation equipment facilities, materials, and sod or other appropriate ground cover.

Staff Comment: Objective 7-1.1 and Policies 7-1.1.1, 7-1.1.13, and 7-1.4.4 above deal with evaluating, assessing, and setting standards for the needs of the City's Parks and Recreation system wholistically. While this objective and subsequent policies are appropriate and should remain in the Comprehensive Plan, they require annual evaluation of the system based on uses and future needs. However, there is no guiding document specific to the Parks and Recreation system that drives planning for specific future needs and appropriate development thereof. Due to this gap, Staff recommends the development of a Parks and Recreation Master Plan to help fill this gap and guide the growth and development of the City's Parks and Recreation facilities that address the residents and visitor's needs.

- 5) **Policy 7-1.5.1: Coordination with Other Recreation Providers.** The City Recreation Committee shall host and facilitate annual meetings with the representatives of both public and private recreation providers, as well as owners of recreational properties in the City to assess the needs of the community.

Staff Comment: This policy is implemented through the monthly Parks and Recreation Committee meetings held through the year. Staff recommends this policy remain in the Comprehensive plan.

- 6) **Policy 7-1.6.3: Evaluate Potential for Beach Access Impact Fee.** Prior to the next EAR, the City shall evaluate the merits of an impact fee that can be imposed on new development to fund public beach access points demanded by new residents.

Staff Comment: Staff recommends this policy be removed from the Comprehensive plan, and impact fees collected for beach acquisition be attributed and collected through the Parks & Recreation Impact Fee.

This discussion is focused on **Chapter 7: Recreation and Open Space Element** of the currently adopted Comprehensive Plan. Staff is seeking direction and guidance on whether the current policies discussed in this Staff Report are to be either kept, updated, or removed.

CHAPTER 7: - RECREATION AND OPEN SPACE ELEMENT

Editor's note— Ord. No. 12-13-PC, § 6(Exh. A), adopted November 3, 2014, amended chapter 6 in its entirety to read as herein set out. Former chapter 6, pertained to similar subject matter. See Table of Amendments for complete derivation.

(Reference Section 163.3177(5)(e) FS)

Introduction. The Recreation and Open Space Element sets forth the parks and recreation-related lands and facilities needed to serve the population of the City, both residents and visitors. This element is prepared pursuant to Section 163.3177 (5)(e) Florida Statutes.

This Element is supported by the Coastal Resources Data, Inventory, and Analysis (DIA) required pursuant to Section 163.3177 (5)(g).

As all others, this Element is organized around a hierarchical series of topical Goals, Objectives, and Policies. The Goals are broad and general, the objectives are specific and measurable, and policies provide legislative and administrative guidance on how to conduct or achieve the goals and objectives.

The major topics of this element include:

- The establishment of an adequate system of parks and recreation,
- Protection of open space systems,
- Accessibility to parks and shoreline area,
- Assurance of adequate provision of recreation and park lands and facilities,
- Public and private coordination in planning and implementation of recreation improvements, and
- Sound fiscal management for the provision and maintenance of existing parks.

GOAL 7-1: PROVIDE ADEQUATE RECREATION AND OPEN SPACE. INSURE PROVISION OF AN ADEQUATE COMPREHENSIVE SYSTEM OF PUBLIC AND PRIVATE RECREATION AND OPEN SPACE SITES WHICH MEET THE NEEDS OF EXISTING AND PROJECTED POPULATION.

OBJECTIVE 7-1.1: MONITOR THE ADEQUACY OF THE SYSTEM OF PARKS AND RECREATION. The City shall on an annual basis and prior to adoption of the annual capital budget, review the need for new recreation sites, beach and shoreline access points, and recreation facilities. The analysis shall be predicated on data, standards, and policies contained in the Comprehensive Plan. The analysis shall be directed toward maintaining a system of recreational sites and facilities that are responsive to user needs.

Policy 7-1.1.1: Review Recreation Needs Annually. The City shall review recreation space and facility needs on at least an annual basis for compliance with the City's levels of service standards.

Policy 7-1.1.2: Maintain Level of Service Standards for Parks and Recreation Facilities. The City shall promote development of unimproved and under-improved park land and shoreline access resources identified in the recreation and open space inventory and analysis contained in the Comprehensive Plan: Data Inventory and Analysis. The park development plans shall be programmed and scheduled in the capital improvement program and budget. System improvements, including the characteristics of sites and facilities, shall be based on the level of service standards cited in Tables 7-1 and 7-2. Functional population shall be used to measure compliance with adopted level of service standards for recreation facilities and space. Functional population equals permanent residents (i.e., the U.S. Census definition for permanent resident) and seasonal population.

Policy 7-1.1.3: Maintain Parks in Accordance with Adopted Level of Service Standards. The City shall provide park and recreation sites in accordance with the level of service standards set forth in Table 7-1 and recreation facilities in accordance with the level of service standards set forth in Table 7-2.

Policy 7-1.1.4: Maintain Existing Recreation Land and Facilities. The City shall maintain existing recreation land and facilities through the use of proper management and funding techniques. The City shall assure that recreation land and facilities are well managed, well maintained, and that quality recreation programs are available to all residents and age groups. This shall be partially achieved by continuing efforts toward collecting, maintaining, and updating data concerning public and private resource inventory, recreation improvement, and demand factors, and by improving design criteria and evaluation to attain a high quality park and recreation system.

Policy 7-1.1.5: Develop New Neighborhood Parks. The City shall develop additional neighborhood parks as needed to maintain concurrency. Park locations should be adjacent to or east of Airport Road (the northwest/southeast segment).

Policy 7-1.1.6: Maintain Beach and Shoreline Access Points. The City shall maintain city-owned access points and facilities to encourage public use. Furthermore, the City shall continue to ensure posting such access points, indicating the public may use these easements, rights-of-way, or lots to enter shoreline areas.

Policy 7-1.1.7: Increase Access Points to Gulf Beaches. The City shall continually seek opportunities to establish a minimum of five new public beach access points with access to adequate parking along the western Gulf Beach, west of Henderson Beach State Park. The City shall evaluate the following alternatives prior to any allocation of general revenues for the acquisition of additional access points:

- A. Any appropriate Federal funds;
- B. State grant funds from the Florida Communities Trust Fund, Florida Recreation Assistance Development Program, or other conservation/recreation programs;
- C. Dedication of easements or land for public beach and dune walkovers or other dedication of waterfront land from property owners or developers as conditions of a development order;
- D. Availability of TDC funds or other County funds; and
- E. Impact Fees.

Policy 7-1.1.8: Improve Access to the Northern Shoreline. The City shall continually seek opportunities to obtain two public access points along the southern shoreline of Choctawhatchee Bay, between Cobbs Point and Indian Bayou. The intent of these access points is to provide waterfront access within walking distance to those residential neighborhoods near or abutting Indian Trail.

Policy 7-1.1.9: Improve Access to the Western Shoreline. The City shall continue its efforts to develop at least one additional public access point to the western shoreline of Choctawhatchee Bay (north of Clement Taylor Park and south of Joe's Bayou) in an effort to provide additional waterfront access within walking distance to those residential neighborhoods near the Bay. The future site should also be evaluated for use as a potential boat launching facility.

Policy 7-1.1.10: Improve Existing Access Points to Joe's Bayou. The City shall continue its efforts to investigate improvements at under-improved or unimproved access points to Joe's Bayou and shall seek opportunities to secure additional surrounding property. Currently,

unimproved or under-improved access points, such as the 4th and 6th Street rights-of-way, may be improved to provide additional waterfront access within walking distance to those residential neighborhoods near Joe's Bayou.

Policy 7-1.1.11: Offer Development Incentives for Beach and Shoreline Access Dedications.

The City shall continue its efforts to promote the dedication of public beach and dune walkovers or other dedications of land for public recreational and open space uses for access to the water within private developments, especially Planned Unit Developments. The Future Land Use Element shall offer density bonuses or other considerations for such dedications within private developments.

Policy 7-1.1.12: Interconnect Mattie Kelly and Joe's Bayou Parks. The City shall operate, own, and maintain the Joe's Bayou Boat Facility and shall implement the master plan for interconnection of the Mattie Kelly Park and Joe's Bayou Recreation Facility.

Policy 7-1.1.13: Evaluate Recreational Activities and Facilities at Park Sites. The City shall annually evaluate facilities and activities occurring or planned at each park site. This annual evaluation shall compare recreation space and facility demands and needs with adopted level of service standards set forth within the Comprehensive Plan.

OBJECTIVE 7-1.2: PROTECT OPEN SPACE SYSTEMS. Open space shall be protected by enforcing open space standards set forth within the Comprehensive Plan and through the designation of public open space areas. The City shall further ensure the provision of open space by public agencies and the private sector through implementation of the policies listed below.

Policy 7-1.2.1: Define Open Space. The terms "Open Space," "Open Space, Pervious Greenscape" and "Open Space, Impervious Hardscape" are defined in the Glossary.

Policy 7-1.2.2: Provide Minimum Open Space Standard in the LDC. A minimum open space standard shall continue to be set forth in the Future Land Use Element. The minimum open space allowed for new development and redevelopment may be further controlled by the LDC but shall not be less than the minimum standard set forth in the Future Land Use Element. Within areas designated as a community redevelopment area (CRA), open space may be transferred to offsite properties within the City according to the ratios, requirements, and procedures set forth within the LDC, or fees may be paid in lieu thereof to the City for the specific purpose of purchasing land set aside as open space.

Policy 7-1.2.3: Preserve through Acquisition or Dedication. The City shall continue to acquire (through lease, acquisition, or dedication) open space and natural areas so as to maintain and improve recreational opportunities for all residents; and the natural function of open space, wetlands and other sensitive lands within the City.

Policy 7-1.2.4: Work with Community Partners and the Public to Provide Ground Cover for Open Space. All open space areas should be planted with landscaping with an emphasis on the use of native vegetation and low-water use plants, except where inappropriate due to public safety concerns, such as airport clear zones or roadway sight-distance. Native trees species, wetland species, and dune vegetation shall be protected according to standards set forth within the LDC regarding preservation, protection during construction, and criteria for removal.

Policy 7-1.2.5: Vertical Open Space and Scenic Vistas. Waterfront views and vistas are important to the character and quality of life for Destin residents as well as for maintaining a viable tourism economy. Site development shall occur in a manner that retains views to shoreline areas for adjacent inland properties, public places, streets, and bicycle pathways. Prior to the next Evaluation and Appraisal Review (EAR) estimated to be in 2019, the LDC shall provide standards that address site development, building mass and height, and fencing design that promote waterfront views and vistas.

Policy 7-1.2.6: Enforce Landscape Standards. The City shall continue to enforce land development regulations which include specific open space definitions and standards addressing protection of open space, natural vegetation, and landscape. Regulations shall include stipulations governing the provision and use of open space for buffering, protection of natural corridors and waterfront vistas, airport clear zones, and other benefits to public welfare.

Policy 7-1.2.7: Protect Open Spaces. The City shall protect open spaces, Destin Harbor, beaches and shores by requiring, within the LDC, setbacks, buffers, dedication of conservation areas, and/or clustering away from such water bodies, floodplains, wetlands, or dune systems.

Policy 7-1.2.8: Open Space and Incompatible Land Uses. To protect lands designated as public open space from impacts created by incompatible land uses, the LDC shall include site design criteria and zoning standards to assure compatible uses and development occur adjacent to open space areas.

Policy 7-1.2.9: Preserve Norriego Point. The City shall continue to coordinate with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), the U.S. Corps of Engineers, and other state agencies regarding the preservation of City-owned lands at Norriego Point as an open space and conservation area.

OBJECTIVE 7-1.3: PROMOTE AND MAINTAIN PARKS AND SHORELINE ACCESSIBILITY. All public parks and recreational facilities shall be designed to promote pedestrian and bicycle activity, minimize automobile impacts, and accommodate access for handicapped and elderly residents.

Policy 7-1.3.1: Coordinate Recreation Plans with Transportation Plans and Improvements.

As future roadway improvements are analyzed, the City shall provide for non-motorized transportation needs using FDOT design standards for bicycle and pedestrian facilities. Recreation plans and improvements shall be coordinated with the bicycle and pedestrian plan adopted within the Transportation Element.

Policy 7-1.3.2: Ensure Beach and Shoreline Facility Design is Compatible with Natural Resources. Public parks and facilities shall be designed and constructed with accessways which are compatible with the character and quality of onsite natural resources.

Policy 7-1.3.3: Provide Facilities for Handicapped and Elderly at City Parks. The City shall assure that public and private facilities including recreation improvements are designed in a manner which incorporates facilities accessible to the handicapped and the elderly, including beach and shoreline access facilities. The City shall maintain the handicapped dune walkover located in the Crystal Beach area so that all citizens, including the aged and handicapped, will have access to the beach. The City shall incorporate when feasible, handicapped accessible facilities when planning to improve existing access points or developing new access points. At least one of the new access points required under Policy 7-1.1.7 shall be designed and constructed with special consideration for handicap access. In addition, the City shall annually request funding from the Okaloosa County Tourist Development Council (TDC) to provide handicap accessibility for public beach/dune walkovers, parks, and open spaces frequented by seasonal population.

Policy 7-1.3.4: Provide Bicycle Parking Facilities. Prior to the next EAR (est. 2019), bicycle storage facilities or racks shall be placed at all city-owned community parks, neighborhood parks, and all beach and shoreline access points.

Policy 7-1.3.5: Provide Public Information Regarding Bicycle and Pedestrian Facilities. Prior to the next EAR, the City shall seek assistance from the Okaloosa County TDC, the Okaloosa County Board of County Commissioners, and/or other appropriate support to print and distribute a pamphlet and/or map illustrating bicycle and pedestrian routes leading to beach access points and other major destinations with the City. This pamphlet and/or information shall be posted on the City's internet site.

Policy 7-1.3.6: Provide Beach, Shoreline, and Park Directional Signage. The City shall continue to provide signage along city rights-of-way to identify location of public beach access points, parks, Bay, Bayou and Harbor access points, and other public recreational facility gathering places. The City shall also coordinate with the FDOT regarding placement of such signage along state roads.

Policy 7-1.3.7: Evaluate Beach/Shoreline Access Parking. In coordination with policies of the Transportation Element, the City shall conduct a survey of all beach and shoreline access points to evaluate automobile parking construction needs.

Policy 7-1.3.8: Provide a Variety of Pathways and Sidewalks Connect Public Spaces. The City will utilize the adopted Pathways Master Plan - 2009 as a map or plan for sidewalk planning and to acquire land to link, via existing or proposed greenways, recreational pathways (trail systems), bicycle lanes, and/or sidewalks, existing and proposed parks, beach/shoreline access points, and governmental buildings and properties.

OBJECTIVE 7-1.4: UTILIZE WORLD CLASS RECREATION FACILITIES AND PARK DESIGN. Recreation space and facilities shall be designed and installed to meet a quality and standards acceptable to the City of Destin. The following policies shall be used to measure the quality of recreation facilities, equipment and design accepted by the City:

Policy 7-1.4.1: Use Creative Concepts of Urban Design and Conservation of Environmentally Sensitive Open Space. All plans for development or redevelopment of park land resources shall incorporate creative concepts of urban design and landscape. The plans shall be designed to enhance controlled access along the shoreline of the Gulf, Harbor and Bay ecosystems with an emphasis placed on the protection of dune and shoreline vegetation. Active and passive recreation areas shall be planned to be compatible with unique natural features of the site. Park development plans shall be designed to preserve environmentally sensitive features of the site. The design shall provide a circulation system to minimize conflict between pedestrians and vehicles. Adequate landscape and screening shall be integrated into park development plans to minimize land use conflicts, protect stability of established residential areas, and enhance community appearance.

Policy 7-1.4.2: Require Recreation Facilities in Planned Unit Developments. The City shall continue to require the provision of recreational facilities, parks, and open space in Planned Unit Developments, Regional Activity Centers or Developments of Regional Impact.

Policy 7-1.4.3: Provide Density Bonuses for Quality Public Recreation Improvements. The City may grant density bonuses for the dedication of and/or the construction of the following public recreational improvements: pools, outdoor theater and band shells, bicycle and hiking

trails, handball courts, tennis courts, basketball courts, baseball/softball fields, soccer fields, multi-purpose fields, skateboard parks, children's play areas/tot lots, recreation/conservation easements on the beach in conjunction with beach renourishment, improved beach/shoreline accesses, or for Harbor Boardwalk extensions or connections subject to the quality of facilities and their design proposed by the developer. If a beach renourishment project is not planned or under way at the time application is made for density bonuses, then the applicant can qualify for density bonuses if they enter into a binding legal agreement which states that when the next beach renourishment project is initiated they and their successors in title give construction easements for the beach renourishment project to proceed. Density Bonuses may be granted for properties the "Tier System" is applicable to as specified in Policy 1-2.1.8, if an application is submitted. Density Bonuses shall not exceed the density specified in the LDC.

Policy 7-1.4.4: Provide Recreation Facility Standards and Guidelines. Prior to the next EAR, the LDC shall include minimum acceptable recreation facilities standards within new residential developments. Additionally, with the above specified timeframe, the City shall develop a recreation facility guideline for residential development that lists minimum acceptable recreation equipment facilities, materials, and sod or other appropriate ground cover.

Policy 7-1.4.5: Maximize Existing Facilities. To maximize the use of existing recreation facilities, the City shall install outdoor lighting at existing and new city parks and beach/shoreline access points where appropriate and compatible with adjacent land uses. The City through its LDC shall also require new development to provide outdoor lighting for recreation facilities where appropriate and compatible with adjacent land uses.

OBJECTIVE 7-1.5: ENSURE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE COORDINATION IN PLANNING AND IMPLEMENTING RECREATION IMPROVEMENTS. During its annual review of recreation site and facility needs, the City shall coordinate planning of recreation improvements with each level of government, including the Okaloosa County School Board, the DEP, and the private sector, in order to promote recreational opportunities in a cost effective manner.

Policy 7-1.5.1: Coordination with Other Recreation Providers. The City Recreation Committee shall host and facilitate annual meetings with the representatives of both public and private recreation providers, as well as owners of recreational properties in the City to assess the needs of the community.

Policy 7-1.5.2: Status of Recreation System and Programs. The City Recreation Committee shall prepare a report, when there are changes, which details the City's recreation facilities and parks. This report shall be provided to the City Council and to the Okaloosa County TDC

to help ensure that the efforts of the City and the TDC are consistent.

Policy 7-1.5.3: Joint School-Park Concept. The City shall continue to promote the implementation of the joint school-park concept by working with the Okaloosa County School Board. The City shall attempt to maximize joint use of the land resources at Destin Elementary School for both school and recreational activities. This concept promotes economic and efficient use of potential park and recreation resources centrally located to potential user groups.

Policy 7-1.5.4: Support Organized Sports Organizations. The City shall support the efforts of organized sports organizations such as the Destin YMCA and the Destin Little League. The City shall create and support both local youth and adult sport leagues of the community.

Policy 7-1.5.5: Coordinate with Henderson Beach State Park. The City shall continue to coordinate with the FDEP regarding reduced entrance fees or other comparable programs for Destin's year-round residents.

Policy 7-1.5.6: Improve Coordination with Other Human Service Planning Efforts. The City shall ensure realistic plans and responsive action to meet identified needs in a cost-effective and fiscally equitable manner by encouraging the use of local park and recreation resources for a wider range of human delivery services (i.e., health information, consumer protection, nutrition, etc.). Coordination should include planning activities to provide a walking and bike trail system throughout the City within open space, park and street corridors. All future recreation facilities shall be designed for multipurpose use where appropriate.

Policy 7-1.5.7: Inform Citizens of Recreation Opportunities and Issues. The City shall coordinate with all appropriate local media, Okaloosa County TDC, and the Destin Chamber of Commerce to advise local residents of activities and special events taking place at City parks. The City shall continue to use its Web site as a medium to announce recreation programs and special events. Outreach efforts shall target residents such as the handicapped or economically disadvantaged who do not regularly participate in recreation programs, as well as more traditional user groups.

Policy 7-1.5.8: Utilize Cooperative Programs. Park and recreation resources shall be used by the City as an instrument for environmental education as well as other adaptive educational programs. This effort shall facilitate the use of local parks as year-round community education and recreation facilities for all age groups.

Policy 7-1.5.9: Review Plans and Policies. Review and amend as necessary existing plans and policies based on continuing analysis of problems and issues related to parks, recreation and open space. These analytical efforts shall include evaluation of major shifts in the indicators

of supply and demand and shall be reviewed on a continuing basis. Identified future land and capital improvements shall be scheduled and programmed in the capital improvement program and budget.

OBJECTIVE 7-1.6: FUND FOR NEW RECREATION FACILITIES AND MAINTENANCE OF EXISTING PARKS. Adequate funding mechanisms and fiscal management programs shall be in place to assure that recreation facilities remain available through proper maintenance and to assure that new development pays for costs to provide parks and facilities which it demands.

Policy 7-1.6.1: Use Best Practices in Fiscal Management. Review and evaluate park land acquisition proposals and recreation development programs to determine changing fiscal implications. Each year fiscal management policies including the capital improvement program and budget shall be reviewed, evaluated, and refined to reflect current program priorities for parks, recreation and open space. The capital improvement program shall reflect changes in recreational needs based on consumer demands, the impact of development trends, and shifts in population magnitude and distribution.

Policy 7-1.6.2: Ensure Provisions for Future Growth and Development to Fund or Provide Recreation Space and Facilities. The City shall continue to impose recreation impact fees on new residential development, including hotel and motel lodging establishments, to pay for the acquisition and/or construction of community and neighborhood parks and facilities demanded by their residents. Recreation impact fee credits shall be allowed for the dedication and construction of new parks and recreation facilities, including beach/shoreline access facilities, when such improvements are dedicated to the public.

Policy 7-1.6.3: Evaluate Potential for Beach Access Impact Fee. Prior to the next EAR, the City shall evaluate the merits of an impact fee that can be imposed on new development to fund public beach access points demanded by new residents.

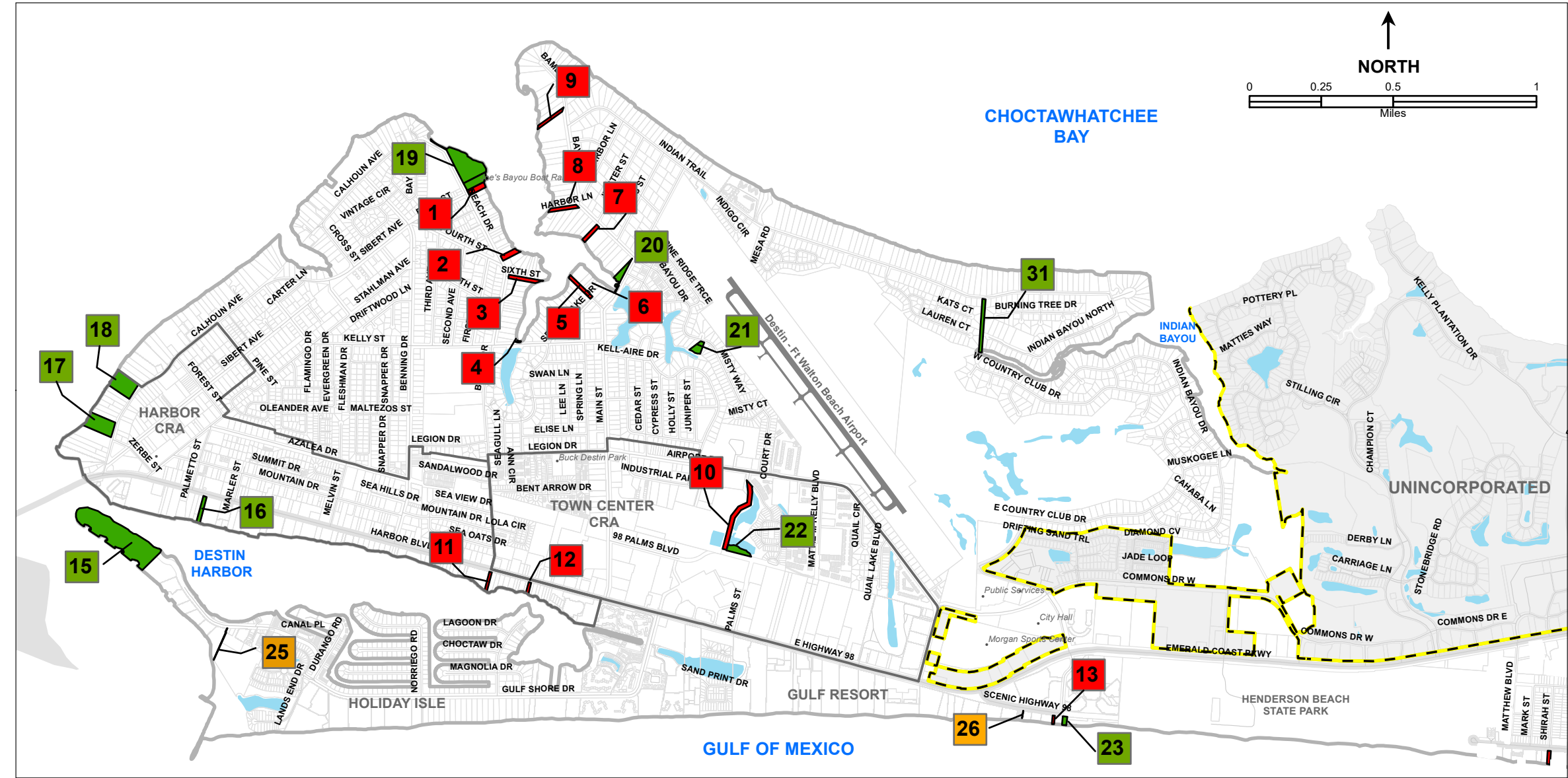
Policy 7-1.6.4: Identify Future Recreation Facilities in Capital Improvements Element (CIE). The City shall schedule and incorporate recreation facility and space capital improvements costing \$25,000.00 or more in the CIE, but may include improvements that are below this amount.

Policy 7-1.6.5: Use Grant Programs and Technical Assistance. The City shall assure that the advantages of all appropriate local and non-local sources of financial and technical assistance are sought and received. Alternative funding sources and impacts must be monitored continually so that appropriate evolving State and federal assistance programs shall be aggressively pursued to ensure the attainment of recreation objectives in a cost effective and fiscally equitable manner.

Policy 7-1.6.6: Create a Trust Fund to be used for Recreational Facilities. Prior to the next EAR, the City shall establish a Trust Fund to receive private donations exclusively dedicated to recreational facilities.

Policy 7-1.6.7: Maintain Recreation Facilities. The City shall continue to earmark sufficient funds to maintain and operate parks and recreation facilities within its annual budget.

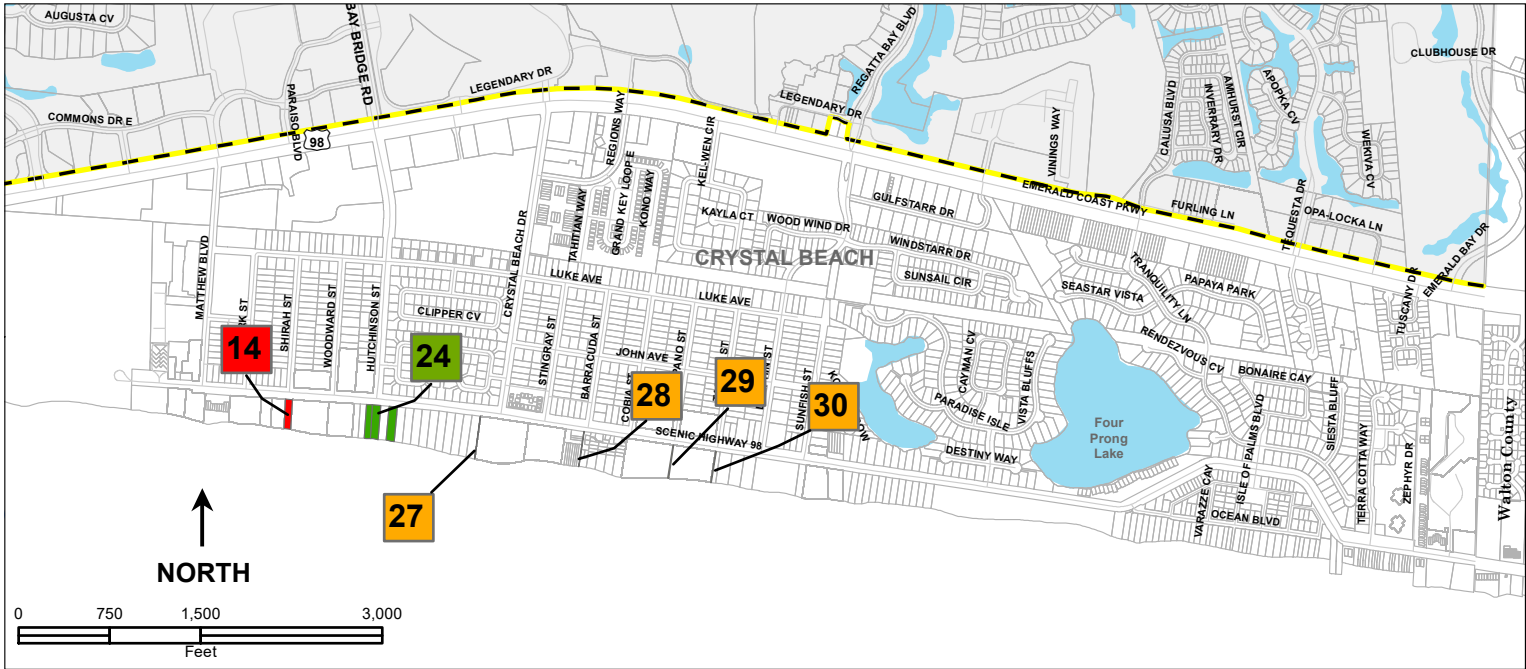
