

**MINUTES OF THE

Chairwoman Trammell called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 22, 2022, in the Destin City Hall Annex Chambers with the Pledge of Allegiance immediately following.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Motion by Committee member Johnson, seconded by Committee member Schmidt, the members voted 5-0 to approve the minutes of the September 29, 2021 and the October 26, 2021 minutes.

5. NEW BUSINESS:

➤ **Stormwater Master Plan Presentation – Joe Bodi**

Mr. Bodi presented the 2022 Stormwater Master Plan to the members. Explaining the plan provides mitigation and strategies for Code revisions to both the Land Development Code and the Comprehensive Plan to ensure consistency for both as well as creating sub-drainage basins using LiDAR which will be conducted by the City's Continuing Services Contractor Jenkins Engineering.

He explained the update identified three (3) study areas, and thirteen (13) drainage projects. The projects were prioritized based upon the Level of Service (LOS) established under the 2004 SWMP list of projects, the SWMP proposes a City-wide Swale Initiative. The City-wide Swale Initiative will identify additional public rights of way and reestablish existing roadside swales (i.e., 3:1 slope) to further improve the MS4 and City LOS for drainage. Furthermore, private stormwater facilities, approved through the Development Order process, will also be part of the City-wide initiative. However, the reestablishment and maintenance responsibility will fall upon the respective Homeowners, Homeowners Associations or Property Management Company.

The objectives are:

- Identify the City's changing needs regarding storm water runoff, from quantity to quality.
- Identify flood mitigation and water quality improvement projects and study areas.
- Provide policy recommendations to provide clear expectations and address deficiencies in the Comprehensive Plan and Land Development Code.
- Provide an avenue for a dedicated funding source for stormwater facilities maintenance and repairs to continue compliance with the State of Florida's National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES).

Below is the list of study areas and identified projects, listed in priority, based upon the 2004 LOS:

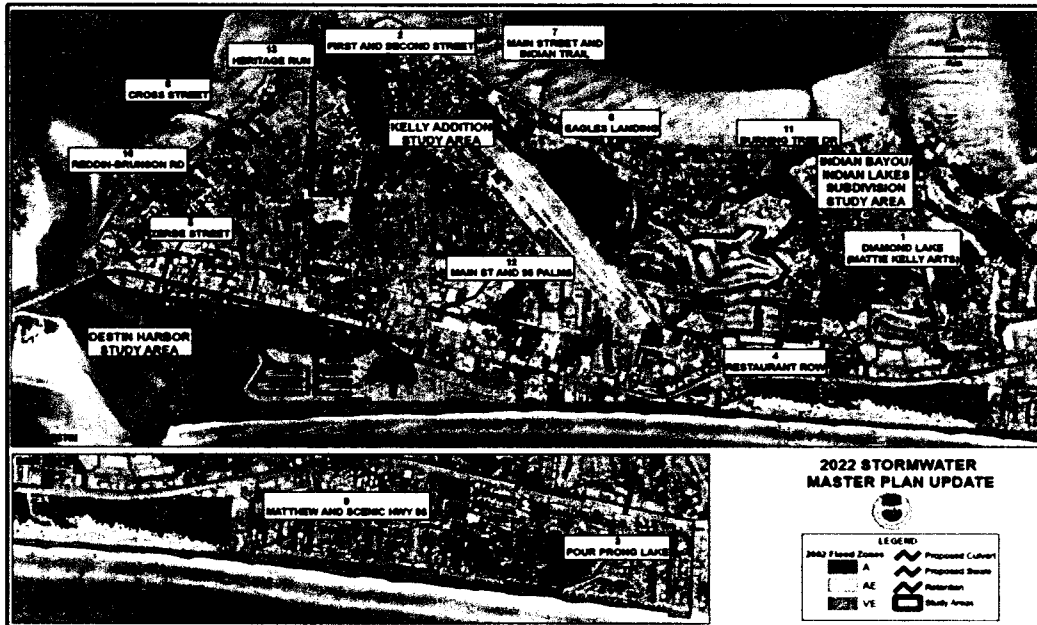

Chairwoman Trammell asked about the stormwater drainage located outside of the airport on Main Street and Indian Trail. According to Mr. Bodi, that will most likely be pipes with culverts and some swales to take the water from the Airport property that drains onto Main Street. Additionally, the airport is looking into expansion in the near future and their stormwater will be addressed.

Committee member Johnson spoke of the project for 1st and 2nd Street and asked if any consideration has been taken for the wetlands that are located across the street from Mattie Kelly but where the water drains over to the Mattie Kelly wetlands. Adding that she is concerned because the owner of the lot is wanting to develop it.

According to Mr. Bodi, the city is aware of their interest, and they have been informed the lot is considered wetlands. Additionally, that parcel will be a part of the comprehensive study that may end up having to be purchased or coming up with some other means of getting the water moved. He also spoke of there being several other dynamics going on in that area but they just won't know anything until after the study is finalized.

Chairwoman Trammell spoke of how wherever there are homes in these areas that have been affected by flooding, they should be put at the top of the list for the study.

Chairwoman Trammell made the motion that wherever stormwater is flooding people's homes, those properties need to be placed at the top of the priority list. Committee member Piper provided the second. The motion passed 5-0.

➤ **Wayfinding Master Plan & Planning Area Project Update – Daniel Butler**

Mr. Butler explained the only change from the last time he presented this to them was a change from the TDD and staff has identified areas of significance for signing. Also, with the city partnering with the TDD for the funding of the program, they have provided some areas they would like to have included in the plan. Staff has identified the main east/west corridors, Marler Bridge, and Danny Wuerffel Way, city facilities, library, and the fishing museum. He also noted, their feedback in to not sign the village areas of the city except for Joe's Bayou has been implemented. Staff is seeking guidance to move forward to go to the LPA one more time for their recommendation to Council for the adoption of the plan.

Motion by Committee member Johnson to recommend the City Council to approve and adopt the Wayfinding Master Plan with Committee member Piper providing the second. The motion passed 5-0.

➤ **Park Inspections**

Mrs. Firth informed the members that she would input the information from their inspections and bring them a comprehensive report where staff is with the repairs. She also reminded the members to continue to make note of any dedicated trees they find in their inspections and report so she can keep the inventory up-to-date.

➤ **Arbor Day**

In discussion, the decision was made to have the Arbor Day/tree planting at Kell-Air North Park, Committee member Schmidt spoke of how she feels two trees should be planted at each side of the entrance of the park.

Aubrey Santucci will be the speaker and Committee member Schmidt agreed to find out if the Pre-K children can attend the event, which will be on April 22, 2022.

Committee member Trammell spoke of how she would like to have a tree planted in the memory of Tammy Scott, who lived just across the street from the park.

➤ **Annual Report & Work Plans**

The members reviewed the Annual Report and Work Plans and discussed minor changes needed. Chairwoman Trammell spoke of needing to make some minor corrections to them before presenting it to Council.

Motion by Committee member Telford to approve the Annual Report and Work Plans and present to Council once the minor changes are made. Committee member Johnson providing the second. The motion passed 5-0.

➤ **Member Comments**

Committee member Johnson commended staff for the Joe's Bayou survey and asked if the results would be presented to them. According to Mrs. Firth, they will be presented to them by Mr. Pierce Barrett along with the plans when they are at the 30% stage.

Chairwoman Trammell spoke of how Council member Wagner has mentioned that he would like to see the park hours extended an additional 30-minutes past sunset for those that like to enjoy it. She also mentioned that she would like to discuss the linear park in the Town Center District and suggests inviting Lockwood Wernet to a meeting to discuss the status.

➤ **Staff Report**

- Royal Melvin Heritage Park continues to be behind schedule and most likely will not be finished by the proposed 4/18 date.
- Easter Egg Hunt – April 16th @ Morgan Sports Center
- Founders Day – 1st Saturday in May (7th)
- Clement Taylor Park still on hold

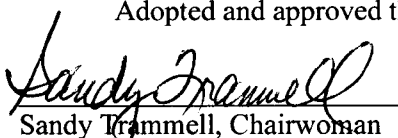

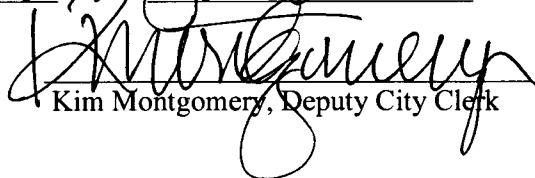
