1. CALL TO ORDER & PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Vice Chairman Ramswell called the Public Works/Safety Committee to order on Tuesday, February 12, 2019 at 5:30 p.m.; which was followed by Pledge of Allegiance.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: December 11, 2018

On a motion by Committee member Schmidt seconded by Committee member Weidenhamer; the members voted 4-0 to approve the December 11, 2018 minutes as written.

4. NEW BUSINESS:

- **No Parking Signs Request:**

- **Twin Lakes Subdivision HOA**
- **Hidden Pines Subdivision HOA**

After discussion, the members agreed with staff's conclusion that the request at Hidden Pines Subdivision is valid because of the numerous vehicles blocking the entrance as well as being within 30-feet of a stop sign; which is regulated by State Statutes. Adding that all the existing signs will be removed and replaced with official regulatory no parking signs that can be enforceable by Code Compliance.

Motion to recommend City Council approve the request by Hidden Pines Subdivision HOA to install official regulatory "No Parking" signs and table the request by Twin Lakes until their next meeting; Committee member Parker provided the second to the motion. A roll call vote of 4-0 was taken and the motion passed.

5. COMMITTEE MEMBER COMMENTS:

Committee member Schmidt – Spoke about the gym bleachers at the Destin Community Center and if it's appropriate to discuss at this meeting. According to Mr. Bodi; that is not under the purview of this committee and he should voice his concern directly to the Parks & Recreation Director, Lisa Firth.

Committee member Parker – Reported that where Kelly Street and Calhoun Avenue intersect, the foliage is overgrown and is blocking the view clearance for drivers trying to pull out to turn left and needs to be trimmed back. The Engineering Assistant stated that he would send a work order but staff is out trimming back ROW's that are not the responsibility of the homeowners.

Vice Chairman Ramswell – Spoke of the agreement made for the reduction of the amount and size of the wayfinding signage and how it seems to be a good agreement made for everyone in the Crystal Beach neighborhood. He also mentioned someone inquired about how the street sign at Gulfshore Drive and Highway 98 letters are worn off and they need to be replaced. According to Mr. Bodi, staff is aware that the letters are worn off however, FDOT is in charge of replacing those signs as part of the 3R project. He added that would inquire if it could get moved up to the top of the list.

6. OLD BUSINESS:

- Explained that the Scope of Work has been finalized and the city is waiting for FDOT to give their confirmation for Volkert; the Engineering Firm awarded the bid by City Council for the Airport Road Improvements

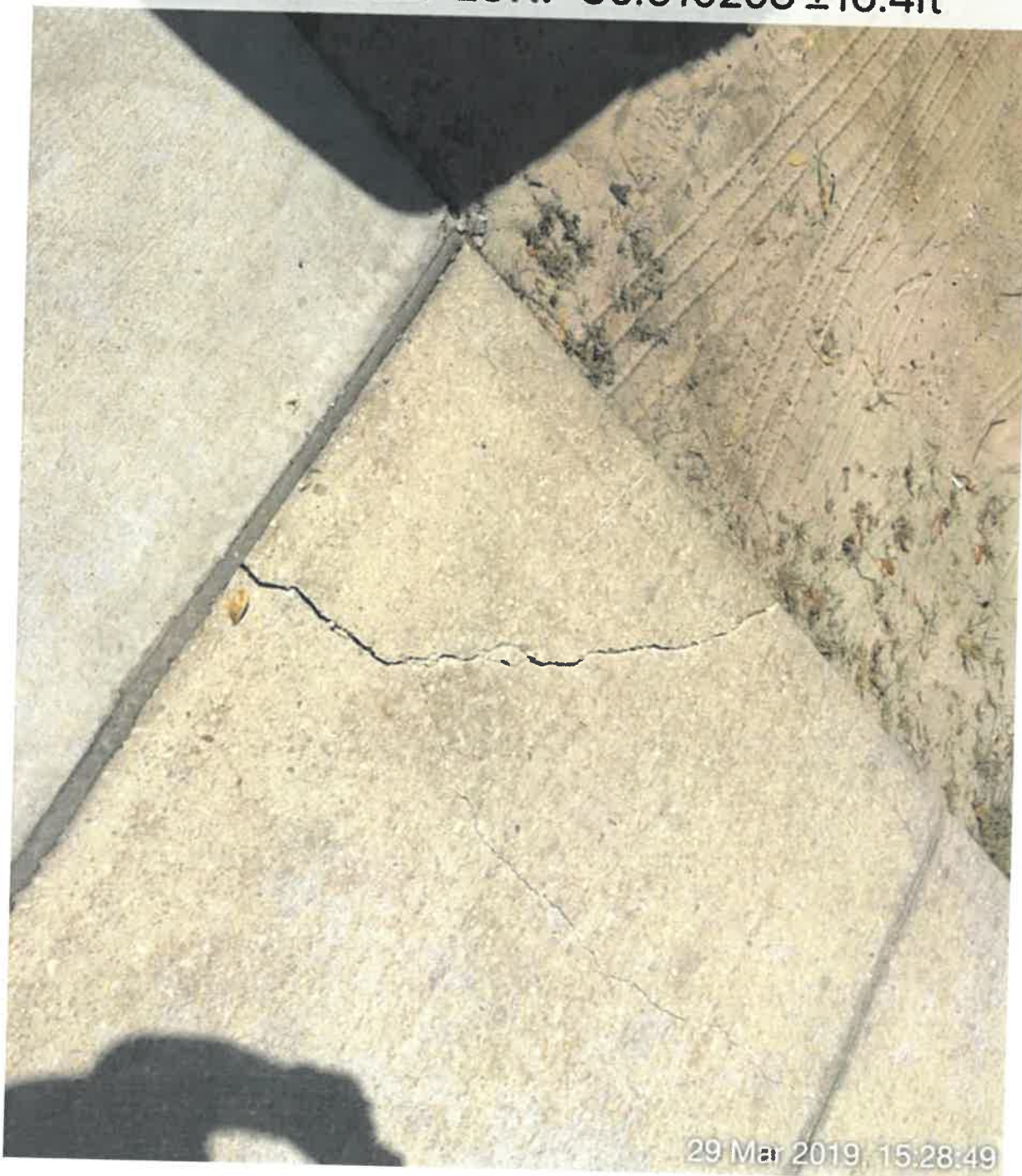

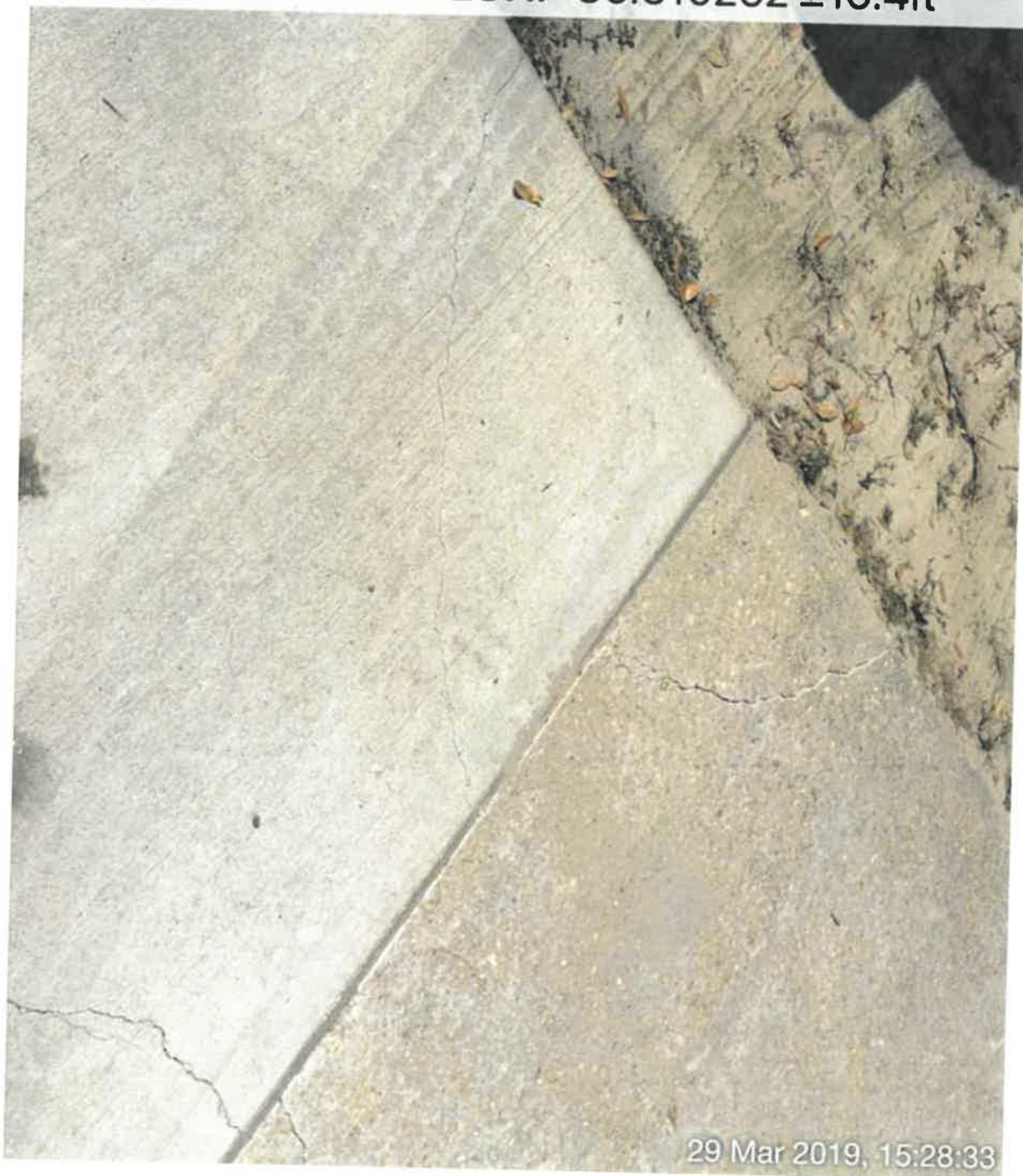

SUBJECT: Monthly Project Progress Report

This is a partial list of projects the Public Services Dept. is currently working on:

1. Staff continues with the citywide tree trimming and should be finishing up the areas east of Airport Rd soon and will move on to the Crystal Beach Area.
2. Staff removed some graffiti from the interior of the pedestrian tunnel near James Lee Park.
3. Staff has restriped the parking lots at the Morgan Sports Complex and at the Joe's Bayou Boat Ramp. Several other parking areas in need of restriping will be completed in the coming weeks.
4. Approximately 7 miles of roadway was cleaned utilizing our street sweeper this week which prevented about 3 cubic yards (approximately 2500 lbs.) of debris from entering our stormwater system and water resources. If you see an area that requires sweeping or a stormwater inlet that needs cleaning, call us!
5. City Staff and one of our continuing service providers cleaned one of four stormwater treatment units this week. Located in a median of Hwy98, this device is designed to remove sediment, bacteria and litter from stormwater runoff before it gets into our Harbor. In addition to the structure on Hwy 98, staff also cleared a storm pipe at Clement Taylor Park. Approximately 12 cubic yards of sediment and pollutants were removed and both areas are now operating as designed.
6. The pedestrian crosswalk on Commons Drive south of the Dog Parks is temporarily Out-of-Order. The parts to make the necessary repairs are on backorder and will take several weeks to arrive. Please take care in crossing at this location.
7. The City of Destin's Adopt-a-Street program is undergoing a few updates. If you wish to participate in the litter-prevention program, contact us at 850-837-4242 and ask for Public Services!
8. So far this week we have received 9 ROW permits and approved 6.
